**DEFEATED WINSLOW TOWNSHIP BOARD OF EDUCATION 2009-2010
BUDGET DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION:**

Mr. Gallagher summarized the additional budget cuts for a total reduction in the amount of \$519,748.00

Mayor Metzner explained the school employees were laid off prior to the budget being voted on.

HEARING ON THE BUDGET:

Gulab Gidwani, 444 Chews Landing Road – He spoke regarding residents with fixed incomes and the lack of good education in the schools.

Clyde Bell, 16 Avella Lane – He believes the State should take over the school system

Merle O'Brien, 30 Ivy Hall Lane – She requested Mr. Gallagher to explain the budget cuts, to which Mr. Gallagher responded.

Peggy Saville, 11 S. Grove Street – She spoke regarding the hardships of unemployment on tax payers.

Joanne Shockley – She read a prepared statement regarding the need for security in the schools, layoffs, cut backs and reducing administrator's pay.

Aleta Sturdivant, 14 Cedar Brook Road – She spoke regarding the "at risk" students in the B.A.S.E. Program

Ms. Hemm, Oak Forest Development – She believes there is a mismanagement of funds. She also stated Camden County Children Services have not been billed by the School District for the aftercare program.

Monica DiNicolas, 15 Breckinbridge Drive – She spoke on the layoffs of non-essential teachers.

Ellen Siers, 25 Winfield Drive – She questioned the amount of the budget reduction, to which Mr. Dringus responded.

Marie Macino, 27 Poplar Avenue – She spoke regarding ways to present a budget to the voters. She believes the School District should extend the pre-k program.

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Herman Bethea, 7 Ashton Lane – He believes there is a lack of communication and the public should be notified prior to budget presentation.

Merle O'Brien, 30 Ivy Lane – She thanked the Mayor and Township Committee for attending the School Board meeting.

Ken Camuso, 16 Cooper Terrace – He supports the teachers and he believes our children need a good education.

Michelle DeStefano, 149 DeSilvio Drive – She questioned who will control the budget, to which Mr. Dringus responded.

Red Walden – He believes there needs to be good communication between the school board and the residents.

Peggy Farley, 165 Glenn Forge Drive – She questioned if the Township Committee has minutes from the last School Board meeting. She also spoke about outsourcing.

Kathy Fry, 245 North Avenue – She stated the School Board Members never visit the schools, they only show up during election time.

Pat Davis – She questioned who is the School Board accountable to. She stated the board members fall asleep and are texting on phones while in meetings.

Gordon Sunkett, 10 Ford Court – He questioned what are the solutions and what we are going to do as a community.

Dawn Pearson, 439 S. Egg Harbor Road – She spoke regarding the effect on the children with the cutting of the B.A.S.E. Program.

Mark Benjamin, School Board Member, 21 Aberdale Lane – He is committed to all children and stated hard decisions have to be made.

Allison Ladd- She questioned where are the funds that were to be used for the new school.

Regina Genovese – She questioned if every option has been considered prior to budget cuts.
