Mr. Hanson reported there was a manhole collapse on Kali Road on March 20th. He described the effect of the collapse to the surrounding area and the work being done to resolve same.

George Smith, President of Police Association – he read a prepared statement. He spoke regarding layoffs and retirements. He expressed concern for public safety due to the proposed layoff of 20% of the police department

Joseph Dico, 123 Maple Avenue – He spoke regarding homes that are flooded and the values of the properties decreasing.

Lori Dico, 123 Maple Avenue – She added they are unable to park in their driveway.

Jean Napoli, 400 Bates Mill Road – She questioned who will pay for their well water to be tested.

Ray Reyes, Arrowwood Avenue- He stated there is a problem with the vents in the Ancora sewer line.

Rich Solis – 212 Greenwood Avenue – He stated there is an article which states there will be sex offenders relocating to Ancora. He also said that the residents in his area do not complain, but he urged the Governing Body not to layoff police officers. He believes that should not have to beg for their jobs.

Lance Henry, 103 Waterford Road – He spoke regarding water running onto his property from the Waterford Farms basin. He gave pictures to the Township Committee. He has not been able to stay in his home since January. He further stated the bond was pulled and nothing has been done to fix his problem.

Carol Blatherwick, 120 Blatherwick Avenue – She spoke regarding the vents in the Ancora sewer line and the vegetation that needs to be replaced. She discussed the problems in the area due to lack of Ancora security. She also spoke about the sex offenders moving to Ancora.

Anthony Mitchell, former Committeeman – He spoke regarding the Guinness Book of World Records relay. He stated he would need fire, police and emergency services. He would like Governing Body members on the relay committee. The relay is tentatively scheduled for May 21st.

Hearing no further comments, Mayor Metzner closed public participation.
