Mr. Platt explained that when an attorney provides legal advice to a non-client who is represented by an attorney, it may be a violation of the attorney code of ethics.

Mayor Metzner added she received the same opinion as Committeewoman Gibison received but from another attorney.

Committeewoman Gibison also expressed her dismay with this Ordinance which increases salaries in light of the recent layoffs and furlough days.

Committeeman Flamini stated that the salary increases comply with the salary ordinance with regard to department heads.

Mayor Metzner disagrees with the 25% increase in the judge's salary. She also stated the emergency management staff did not get an increase since the mid 1990s, but she believes they deserve same.

Mr. Gallagher explained some salaries include stipends and are not raises.

A discussion took place regarding salary increases and stipends.

Committeeman Bates believes there are personal reasons for cutting salaries and wanting to increase others. He discussed the \$100,000.00 that was spent on gypsy moths last year. He also believes that questions regarding the salary Ordinance should have been addressed prior to tonight's meeting.

Mr. Gallagher explained that the Judge's salary increase is based on the 20% increase in court sessions and other on-call duties.
